Call to Confession from Hosea 14:1-2

Leader: Return, O Israel, to the Lord your God, for you have

All: Take with you words and return to the Lord; say to

him, "Take away all iniquity; accept what is good."

Prayer of Confession from Isaiah 64:5-6, 8a, 9

(followed by Silent Confession)

Leader: Lord, we come confessing. You meet him who joyfully

works righteousness, those who remember you in your

ways.

All: Behold, you were angry, and we sinned; in our sins we

have been a long time, and shall we be saved?

Leader: We have all become like one who is unclean, and all our

righteous deeds are like a filthy garment.

All: We fade like a leaf, and our iniquities, like the wind,

take us away.

Leader: But now, O Lord, you are our father.

All: Be not so terribly angry, O Lord, and do not remember

iniquity forever. Please look upon your people, for the

sake of your Son Jesus Christ.

Call to Confession: As we praise God, and through the Spirit showing us, we become aware of our own imperfections in light of our perfect God. In love, God calls us to freely and openly confess our sins before him.

Confession of Sin: Sin is not only something that we've done wrong. Rather, it's a state of being that we're born into, and that we need saving from. It is impossible to conquer sin on our own, or make amends for it by our own actions. Our only hope is to turn to Christ, asking that he forgive and conquer sin for us, and - by grace alone and through faith alone - save us.

Assurance of Forgiveness *Isaiah 54:8, 10*

"In overflowing anger for a moment I hid my face from you, but with everlasting love I will have compassion on you," says the Lord, your Redeemer. "The mountains may depart and the hills be removed, but my steadfast love shall not depart from you, and my covenant of peace shall not be removed," says the Lord, who has compassion on you.

Song of Thanks Abide with Me

Abide with me; fast falls the eventide; The darkness deepens; Lord with me abide. When other helpers, fail and comforts flee, Help of the helpless, abide with me.

Thou on my head, in early youth didst smile; And, though rebellious, and perverse meanwhile, Thou hast not left me, though I oft left Thee, On to the close Lord, abide with me.

I fear no foe, with Thee at hand to bless Ills have no weight, tears lose their bitterness Where is thy sting death? Where grave thy victory? I triumph still, abide with me.

Assurance of Forgiveness: As we confess our sin, God offers us the assurance that, in Jesus, we are forgiven and loved regardless of what we've done in the past. Because of Jesus, we are no longer condemned by our sin, but are brought into new life by the Spirit.

Song of Thanks: Knowing that we are forgiven, and knowing that Jesus has reconciled us with God the Father, we sing with thankful hearts.

Statement of Faith Apostles' Creed

I believe in God the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth;

And in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. Central text Mark 1:1-8

¹The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

²As it is written in Isaiah the prophet,

"Behold, I send my messenger before your face, who will prepare your way,

³ the voice of one crying in the wilderness:

'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight,"

⁴ John appeared, baptizing in the wilderness and proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵ And all the country of Judea and all Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. ⁶ Now John was clothed with camel's hair and wore a leather belt around his waist and ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷ And he preached, saying, "After me comes he who is mightier than I, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. ⁸ I have baptized you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

Reader: The Word of the Lord

All: Thanks be to God!

Sermon Discussion Questions - Mark 1:1-8

- 1. One of the main characteristics of Mark's gospel is that he doesn't waste any time getting to the point. We see this in the opening verse, for example. Looking at verse 1, discuss the significance of the following words (biblically, theologically, etc): beginning, gospel, Christ, and Son of God.
- 2. Even though he only cites Isaiah, Mark is also referencing Malachi 3 and Exodus 23 in verses 2 and 3. Why does Mark believe it's so important for his readers to know that Jesus' coming was the fulfillment of OT prophecy? (cf. Lk 24.27)
- 3. Describe a 'wilderness' you've experienced in your own life. How did God use that experience to expose idols in your heart? Was there a 'voice crying in the wilderness' from a friend or mentor (or song, movie, book, etc) that God used to provide comfort or encouragement during that time?
- 4. Notice that John was not calling the people out into the wilderness to "try harder" or "do better" but to merely repent. When seeing this in light of Jesus coming as the Messiah, why is this truly the best news anyone could ever hear?
